The First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) Health Protection Team is pleased to invite you to the Not Just Naloxone (NJN) Train-the-Trainer workshop. This three day workshop is for health workers in rural and urban First Nations communities. The workshop is focused on supporting participants as they develop community teachings on overdose through the lens of cultural safety and trauma-informed care. Topics of focus will include decolonizing addiction, Indigenous harm reduction, and recognizing and responding to overdoses.

We encourage participants to register in pairs, so they can work with a partner in their community or organization to implement trainings after the workshop.

Training materials, breakfasts and lunches will be provided to all participants.
