### Housing Need

P.I.T Count 2020: 3,634 people were homeless 33% were Indigenous, or 1,999

### Housing Need

Lu'ma Native Housing has over 6,000 people on their waiting list for housing.

### Housing Need

2,500 – 6,000 units needed to transition people out of homelessness in Vancouver proper alone.

Vancouver Native Housing, Lu'ma Native Housing, the Native Education College, the Vancouver Aboriginal Friendship Centre, and the Urban Native Youth Association continue to work with municipal, provincial, and federal housing providers to get shovels in the ground for current projects for various segments of the Urban Indigenous population. Join us to build change through an Urban Indigenous Strategy that matches the COV City Wide Plan.

### Action 3: Future Housing

Sign a MVAEC Housing Development Partnership Agreement

Implement an Action Plan that compliments City Wide Plan

### Action 4: Annual Outcomes

Partners evaluate collaboration on annual basis
